Texas Vignette's mission is purposeful and aims to build a community for women in the arts. Members have been invited to quarterly events (studio visits, happy hours, etc.). In the coming year, this community of women in the arts will continue to grow and thrive, beginning with the exceptional artists of Vignette 2019.

WELCOME TO VIGNETTE

In literary terms, a vignette is a brief description meant to give a detailed portrayal of a character or scene. One can also use the technique of vignetting, in photography, to highlight an area of an image that the artist wants the viewer to focus on. In art and graphic design, however, the vignette is a small or repetitive image often placed around borders and relegated to the background, as it is thought of as simply decorative.

Vignette Art Fair was conceived along these lines as an alternative fair that highlights talent that has been under-recognized and made ancillary by art institutions and establishments. This satellite fair will bridge the gap between local and international art scenes by displaying the work of creative female, and female-identifying, minds during a time when the international art market descends on the city.

Vignette 2019 is curated by the brilliant Leslie Moody Castro, who has worked throughout Texas and Mexico on various curatorial projects, bringing astounding skill and experience to this year's fair. Our third annual fair will also continue the strong tradition of programming with Viewpoints, two panel discussions with local leading industry professionals discussing the complexities of curating women's art and feminist movements in art, as well as Vocations, a section of the fair dedicated to local women-owned businesses.

Vignette Art Fair feels particularly necessary this year in light of current events. Yet the curator, artists, vendors, and panelists in Vignette 2019 have been shaping the cultural landscape of Texas for decades. They are museum professionals, writers, teachers, creatives, and instigators of social change that range from emerging to established, and I am extremely proud that this year's fair will showcase this wide array of talent. I hope you will enjoy this alternative fair and thank you for supporting this community of women.





VIGNETTE CURATOR

LESLIE MOODY CASTRO

I have had dreams about the Texas Women's Building. I've walked through its hidden nooks and crannies. I've let my hands run across the cases and cabinets that once existed to tell the stories of the women that helped form the state of Texas. I have read the remnants of texts lingering on the walls that once defined legacies. In my dreams the building is alive and it is an active protagonist in a story of histories that have passed through it.

A building is never static nor just an empty space. It carries with it the intentions of architects attempting to leave their footprint on the world. Architecture shapes skylines, urban plans, and acts as the silent witness to growing cities. However, it is the nuance of the building that I dream of, and I continually come back around to ask how does a building perform?

In this building, histories and legacies have been told and retold in order to prove the importance of the stories of women. The walls were built in order to project the legacies of women who have bravely lead justice to a cause, committed their voice to a service, and trail-blazed with fury before us. These histories have become part of this nearly forgotten space, and the stories have been absorbed into its walls. These legacies are part of this architecture, and this space a performance of value and validation.


Inevitably, Vignette becomes part of this legacy. The 78 women who are once again activating this space are breathing a new life into it, and contributing the history of rebel women in our state. For the 2019 fair we are occupying the building to tell our stories, claim our space in history, and add our voices to the performance of these walls. Texas Vignette 2019 will manifest the dreams that I have had about this building, but more importantly, of the legacy that we are inserting ourselves into.


Leslie Moody Castro is an independent curator and writer whose practice is based on itinerancy and collaboration. She has produced, organized, and collaborated on projects in Mexico and the United States for more than a decade, and her repertoire of critical writing is also reflective of her commitment to place. She is committed to creating moments of artistic exchange and dialogue and as such is a co-founder of Unlisted Projects, an artist residency program in Austin, Texas. In 2017, she was selected as Curator and Artistic Director of the sixth edition of the Texas Biennial, and was recently the first invited curator in residence at the Galveston Artist Residency. Moody Castro earned a Master's degree at The University of Texas at Austin in Museum Education with a portfolio supplement in Museum Studies in 2010, and a Bachelor's degree in Art History at DePaul University in Chicago in 2004, and has been awarded two grants from the National Endowment of Arts for her curatorial projects (2016, 2017).
